Remote Learning

Remote Learning can be a challenge for families



and carers. Here at Winchburgh Primary School we are committed to supporting you and your family whilst we navigate through these times.

It is important to note that remote learning will need to fit your family's needs and should not require your children to be working on their digital device all day. Class teachers design activities that encourage pupils to be active away from devices too.

What does remote learning look like at present?

- Teachers will provide a weekly overview of the learning to be shared
- A variety of live and pre-recorded lessons will take place throughout the week
- Teachers will also hold regular Health and Well-being check-ins with pupils
- Tasks will be posted via MS Teams / SeeSaw

How will this be delivered?

Pupils will have the opportunity to work with their peers and their teachers via;

- video
- live lessons
- recorded lesson and presentations
- written and audio feedback
- group meetings online with PSW's

Some Top Tips for Remote Learning

1. Establish routines that suit your family's needs.
2. Choose a good place to learn.
3. Stay in touch — we are here to help in any way we can.
4. Help pupils to 'own' their learning.
5. Begin and end the day by checking-in (connect in with SeeSaw or MS Teams sessions).
6. Family first — be kind to yourselves and don't let remote learning cause undue stress, (*doing some is better than doing none*).
7. Establish times for quiet and reflection.
8. Encourage breaks, physical activity and exercise.
