What is a School Travel Plan?

Definition:

"A Travel Plan is a document put together by a school or a group of schools which sets out a package of short, medium and long-term measures to encourage more children, young people and staff to choose alternatives to the car when making the journey to school"

It signifies an all-round commitment to develop safer routes to school. The need for travel plans has arisen due to growing concerns over:

- Increasing congestion associated with the 'school run'
- Pupil health concerns concerning inactive lifestyles
- The need for pupils to gain "road sense" and independence
- Road safety issues and concerns partly generated by school run related traffic
- Air quality and climate change

Our School Travel Plan Document has been written to help pupils, parents/carers and teachers engage with our school travel plans.

Travel Plan Working Group Members

We have a working group to look at our school travel issues. Our group includes representatives from staff, pupils, parents and our local community.

Our Junior Road Safety Officers were presented at our whole school assembly. They discussed our school travel issues, they launched initiatives to encourage us to cycle, walk and scoot to school.



1. AIMS

The aims of our School Travel Plan are...

- To increase awareness amongst pupils, parents and staff about the health, environmental and social consequences of their travel choices
- To reduce traffic congestion around the school gates
- Increase the number of children walking, cycling or scooting to school
- To improve safety on the journey to school by reducing car use
- To review the School Travel Plan on a regular basis

SchoolIntroduction

General Information about our School

Winchburgh Primary School is a non-denominational school and has approximately 430 pupils currently organised across 19 classes. Our ELC has approximately 65 pupils. As our school is situated in an area of rapid growth this number changes regularly. The building was opened in 1971 and has more recently undergone extensions to add new classrooms and ELC space. The building is all on one level with 3 main access gates for pupils arriving at the school. We have a large playing field and 2 tarmac play areas with play equipment.

Main entrance

- Shared entrance for staff, parents/carers, access to school office
- Our P1 pupils enter their classrooms via the external doors straight into the classroom

South Entrance

- Playground access via the main gate to the Breakfast Club in the am
- Entrance to bike rack and scooter area
- Access for pupils

North Entrance

- Access to the ELC and the North playground
- Bike and Scooter Storage area

Car Park Entrance

- Entry for staff parking
- Kitchen deliveries and school deliveries are accessed for this entrance also

4. Present Travel Patterns

Arrival

Wet clothes can be left to dry in their classrooms A secure space for personal items such as clothes, bikes helmets, lights is provided

Car parking

Sufficient car-parking spaces are available near school main entrance Parents are allowed to park nearby
There is a car park on our site for Winchburgh PS staff only
There are a separate pedestrian /cycle exits
We encourage 'Walk to School' for parents/carers and pupils

Access by foot

We take part in the Big Pedal, Hands Up Survey, taking part in walk to school week/days.

Cycling Access/Bike Bus

Cycling is allowed and actively encouraged, along with scooting.

We have limited cycle parking spaces. Our Friday Bike Bus is organised by our parents.

Road Safety Education

Road safety is currently taught, across the school from Primary 1-7.

School Crossing Patrol

The school have a lollipop person at the Niddry Road and the Traffic light crossing at the Main Street.

Travel Information

Our School Travel Plan on travel to your school is on the school website. We have a map site for pupils and parents in our School Travel Plan.

6. Consultation: Surveys and Data

We collect data on how pupils and staff currently travel to the school, how they would like to travel to school if given the choice, and what barriers prevent them from walking and cycling.

We use the results of the Hands Up Survey with extra information taken from focus groups, which helps us to give a picture of how things stand, what the issues are and to involve people in our school.

7. Summary of Survey Findings and Consultations

We analysed the data collated from the hands up survey, sharing what we have found out from the surveys and consultations. For example:

The main points we have learnt are:

walk	cycle	scoot	park & stride	driven	bus	taxi	other

The main barrier children face to walking to school is weather, distance and time.

8. Action Plan

Hold regular meetings with our Travel Plan Group to discuss the results and decide on actions to help us solve the issues and meet the original aims. We consider any extra aims the travel plan can achieve like competitions, opportunities to raise awareness of the importance of road safety.

We discussed actions/ initiatives our school would like to start. These should be relevant and achievable.

Our aims are;

To encourage sustainable travel:

- Walk to School events
- Investigate more cycle/scooter rack
- Investigate a one-way system with parent council

To promote road safety:

- Use online road safety materials to raise awareness
- Support JRSO activity in school

To raise awareness:

- Publish the Travel Plan on the school website
- Have a JRSO travel plan noticeboard
- Have school travel on agenda for Parent Council meetings
